I. Call to Order Rae Madison called the meeting to order at 8:00am.

I. Announcements and Events

- A. Rae welcomed the group and members introduced themselves. Rae will serve as co-chair and Rishi Seshadri will serve as SHAB chair this coming year.
- B. Jenny and Rae discussed the mission and purpose of SHAB for the new members. SHS, like other fee-funded units, utilizes a student advisory board to help set and approve fees, and otherwise serve to promote the mission of the unit. SHS leadership will work with SHAB students to set and present the FY18 budget to the Student Incidental Fee Committee in January. SHAB members will also discuss programs, services and the needs for SHS in the future. Of particular interest are future opportunities for SHS to generate alternate forms of revenue.
- C. Student Health Services received an 8% fee increase for 2016-17. This will bring SHS closer to the fee level needed to fully fund SHS. The unit has been spending down reserve funds at the direction of a past SIFC for the past several years. A second increase will be requested for the coming year (FY18). The amount needed has yet to be determined.
- D. The Student Incidental Fees Committee includes members from different boards. As the SHAB Chair, Rishi was appointed as a member of SIFC for 2016-17. Theresa Thurston was elected to SIFC last spring. Rae Madison is also servicing as the CAPS Advisory Board chair so she will be part of SIFC. This year's SIFC chair is Peter Schwartz; he was co-chair last year.
- E. Jenny discussed some current challenges and future needs for SHS, including the need for more mental health staffing (i.e., an additional psychiatrist). Jenny pointed out that students are coming with more serious and chronic health needs as well.
- F. Jenny and Rae spoke about the increasing impacts of mental health on campus, a trend recognized nationally. More clinical providers, while necessary, will not be sufficient in meeting the need. This necessitates more efforts at the non-clinical level.
- G. Jenny mentioned that e-campus students now have the option to pay the OSU Health Fee and access SHS and CAPS. These students also have the option to purchase the OSU student health insurance plan if they live within 50 miles of campus and have paid the Health Fee.
- H. Students at Hatfield Marine Science Center pay the Health Fee and thus have access to SHS and CAPS. OSU Cascades students do not pay the fee. The Cascades campus has hired a health navigator to assist students in finding healthcare within the Bend community. There is a counselor on staff at Cascades.
- I. SHS's expanded immunization requirement has been fully implemented. This fall SHS received a state grant that has provided vaccines free of cost to students. SHS will hold two flu vaccine clinics in October that will provide immunizations for students, faculty and staff for a fee.
